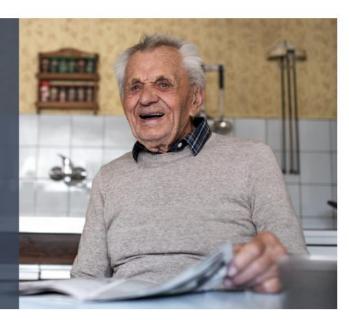
Cultivate Central Oregon

Latino Community Outreach

Our Bilingual Case Manager, Ulysses Vargas, has been working diligently to expand our services to Spanish speakers across Central Oregon. Ulysses provides help to members of our community who might otherwise fall through the cracks in the system due to the language barrier.

"When I was conducting the Meals on Wheels home assessment with Maria in Spanish, I learned about her struggles with daily living and the active home repairs she needed. There was no running water in her bathroom sink, and she had been walking all the way to the kitchen to wash her hands. I worked with our partners at Friend2Friend to fund Maria's sink repair at no cost to her.

Being able to speak to Maria in her own language made this accomplishment happen. She was happy to see that, for the first time in her 25 years living in Bend, a Central Oregon organization (The Council on Aging) could now provide services for seniors in Spanish."



Thanks to Ulysses, we now are able to offer Information and Resources (our Help Desk), Meals on Wheels, and family caregiver respite grants fully in Spanish. If you or an older loved one needs help in Spanish, call Ulysses at (541) 527-0895.

- Treat your Medicare card like a credit card to protect your identity.
- Don't take advice or offers of medical services from people you don't know.
- Get help from the Council on Aging's free Medicare counselors. If you need help understanding your Medicare Summary Notice or Explanation of Benefits, or have any other questions related to Medicare, call (541) 678-5483.
